How do I get started?...

1. Go to www.fundscrip.com and register under 20th Burlington Scouts.
2. Place your order in time for our monthly delivery (see attached schedule).
3. You can choose to have electronic funds transferred from your own personal account. Follow instructions online.

OR

You can pay through '20th Burlington Fundscrip' account if you prefer not to share personal banking info with Fundscrip. You make get payment prior to order date. (see attached schedule).

4. Pick up your order at Section meetings and then Shop and earn!!
